
Scene 1:



The residents are surprised to discover that Maria and Chris have already moved without informing the community, sparking a heated discussion about their future and the effects of relocation. Natalie, the association's chair, adamantly opposes leaving despite receiving an offer for alternative housing in Clacton. The residents feel frustrated and helpless facing the threat of losing their homes and community to the developer's plans. The impending movie filming at the centre exacerbates the residents' feelings of displacement. In essence, the document captures the emotional strain of the residents as they confront the potential loss of their homes and community, emphasizing themes of resistance, resilience, and the impact of external forces on their close-knit community.


Scene 2 - Setting Building

Scene 2:

• The document describes a clash between housing estate residents and a film crew taking over their community centre for a 1960s film shoot. Danielle and Ruby express frustration about not being informed, feeling displaced from their space. Tensions rise as Charlotte, the crew leader, insists on the residents leaving due to a double booking. The confrontation intensifies as residents question the lack of communication, and a crew member, Tim, tries to remove the community centre sign. A stand-off ensues. Charlotte calls security to remove residents, reflecting their intrusion and lack of control over their living space. The second part shifts to the first day of shooting for "Giant Killer." Despite tensions, the director, Jeremy Hardcastle, emphasizes the film's importance in the face of opposition from the council and new owners. The document captures the clash between the community's desire to protect their space and the film production's determination, highlighting power dynamics and conflicts when external forces invade a community without consent.












- Using a darker theme would be a huge part of this poster because I don't want to expose the film fully by adding too many details.






